Faecal-Immunochemical Testing (FIT) is a test that can identify signs of bowel disease, which is being implemented across Wales across primary and secondary care. "The implementation of the CAV FIT pilot amidst extraordinary circumstances has been a successful collaboration between primary and secondary care. Thanks to the concerted effort by teams in gastroenterology, colorectal surgery, primary care, radiology and PHW, this has been rolled out to around 7000 patients in 11 months.' We have heard about the great progress that has been made and had some good feedback from clinicians on using FIT in their practice. We've also heard about some challenges that colleagues are facing and areas where additional support would be welcomed. Five Welsh Health Boards have now fully rolled out its use across low-risk and high-risk populations.
