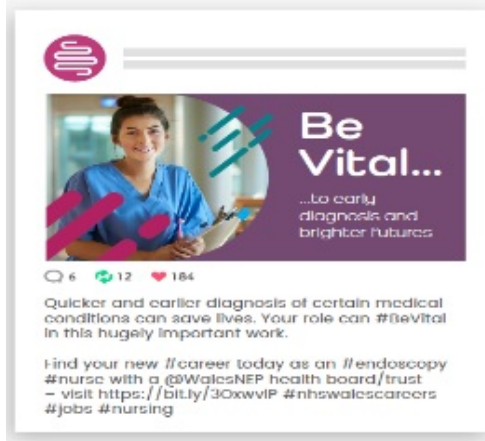

Attraction Campaign #BeVital

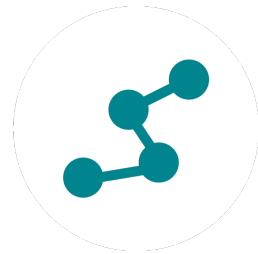
The endoscopy **#BeVital** attraction campaign has been finalised and will shortly go live!



Latest Workstream Updates

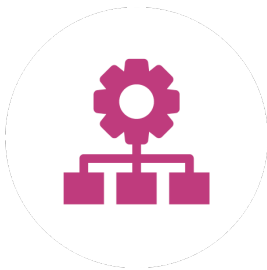
Clinical Pathways

- The workstream are pleased to announce that the first Colon Capsule Endoscopy procedures as part of the national pilot have taken place the past few weeks – with the first being carried out in Ysbyty Gwynedd, Betsi Cadwaladr UHB in mid-September. Cardiff & Vale UHB and Swansea Bay UHB have now also carried out their first procedures, and Cwm Taf Morgannwg UHB plans to start next month. It is an exciting time for this project and we will continue to support these pilots through the delivery and evaluation stages throughout the rest of 2022/23. As a Bevan Exemplar, this pilot is receiving funding and support from the Bevan Commission – read more on their website now [Piloting Colon Capsule Endoscopy \(CCE\) in Wales - Bevan Commission](#).
- We have been revisiting the work on Specialist endoscopy services that are offered in Wales and revised questionnaires have recently been sent out to Health Board leads to request information. We will be grateful to receive responses as this will enable us to provide an accurate, up-to-date overview of specialist endoscopy services across Wales and to inform further work.



Demand and Capacity

- Revised and updated national D&C model created and distributed to health boards for submission back to the programme
- New model is pre-populated with data submitted to the programme in order to lessen the completion requirements on health boards
- Model now contains more granular capacity which is split by endoscopists, infrastructure (rooms) and suite staff - and can discern the expected bottleneck between them for a given week.



Facilities and Infrastructure

- Programme is continuing to offer support to Health Boards on their progress in compliance against the JAG accreditation standards. This includes monthly drop-in sessions focused on specific standards, with support from the National JAG team. *Please get in touch if there are specific areas of support you would value from the Programme*
- Annual decontamination audits are continuing to be undertaken by Shared Services to advise Health Board on the standard of their decontamination facilities. The programme is supporting Health Boards by escalating key risk areas.

Informatics

- Welsh Clinical Portal - Following on from the successful Welsh Clinical Portal (WCP) updates at Hywel Dda and Swansea Bay University Health Boards, Endoscopy results for Powys Teaching Health Board are now available in the Welsh Clinical Portal.



Workforce, Training & Development

- Local workforce plans are being developed for endoscopy services across Wales and will be finalised end of October 2022.
- Clinical Endoscopist national job descriptions have been developed and the consultation period ended on 30th September 2022, the job descriptions will be matched in November 2022, further communication to interested parties to follow.
